PUBLIC INSTITUTIONS	Besides municipal departments, which public institutions contribute to disaster risk management, climate change adaptation/mitigation and resilience in your city? MEDIA & ACADEMIA	Identify local, regional or national media as well academia members studying/working in your city or interested in the field of urban resilience.
INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS	Identify international organisations/donors working on urban development, governance and /or disaster risk management, disaster relief or any other relevant field of action in your city.
