






Selected cities

Selection criteria:

- High exposure to climate-related hazards.
- Fast growing small/intermediate cities with a population ranging between 50,000 and 150,000 inhabitants.
- Cities in which the UN-Habitat has recently engage in implementing risk reduction and resilience building activities (e.g. CityRAP).







The city level

Main partner:



Oxfam Italia Sub-projects implementation plans fully developed with communities and municipalities, including detailed engineering studies.

Priority sub-projects are implemented in the four target cities mainly through community involvement as labour-intensive manpower.

Municipal staff and community members mobilised, trained and equipped for ensuring the sustainable management and/or maintenance of the implemented priority sub-projects.

- Regional workshops organized for experience sharing among the different countries, and participation to global events.



- > The project complies with AF requirements based on their 15 Environmental and Social Principles and Gender Policy, as well as UN-Habitat's ESSS.
- > Comprehensive ES risk screening and impact assessment were conducted and an Environmental and Social Management Plan developed, measures to avoid or mitigate potential risks have been duly identified.
- > Further site visits conducted in October 2018 and community consultations held to strengthen this plan, which was also presented to the communities in a public disclosure event.
